

Michael Rustin is a Professor of Sociology at the University of East London, where he was formerly Head of Department of Sociology and Dean of the Social Sciences Faculty. He is a Visiting Professor at the Tavistock Clinic, where he has contributed to the development of many university-accredited programmes in the field of psychotherapy and community mental health. He has written on the relations between psychoanalysis and various aspects of society, politics, and culture, and on other sociological and political topics. He is author of *For a Pluralist Socialism*, *The Good Society and the Inner World*, and *Reason and Unreason: Psychoanalysis, Science and Politics*, as well as *Narratives of Love and Loss*, and *Mirror to Nature*, with Margaret Rustin, and *The Inner World of Doctor Who (2013)* with Iain MacRury. *Social Defences against Anxiety: Explorations in a Paradigm*, co-edited with David Armstrong, will be published by Karnac Books in November 2014. He is an Associate of the British Psychoanalytical Society.
